

RIVER NAVIGATION COURSE

These courses are taught by professional, certified, and experienced whitewater rafting guide instructors and are condensed versions of our 12-day Commercial Raft Guide Training Course. The courses have been designed with a focus on anglers, fishing guides, and recreational river boaters, of all skills levels from beginner to expert, who may float rivers with pontoon boats, rafts, and drift boats, and who want to enhance their knowledge of river safety, river dynamics and skills to safely navigate rivers with finesse.

LOCATION

Course location is the [Kumsheen Rafting Resort](#), located 5 km east of Lytton, with on-river training on the Nicola River or Thompson Rivers. Camping at Nicomen Falls.

Training starts at 8 a.m. in the classroom and ends after a river session at approximately 6 p.m.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Kumsheen Raft Adventures has been training commercial raft guides for over 40 years.

INSTRUCTORS:

The lead instructors will be Darren Wagner and Braden Fandrich.

Darren has been rafting and kayaking since 1986, including 11 seasons as a raft guide (10 seasons with Kumsheen and one in New Zealand). He also taught the Guide Training Program for 5 years. Darren currently works as an Emergency Paramedic with BC Ambulance Service, and spends his spare time fly fishing and playing with his spey-rod.

Braden grew up on rivers, rafting and kayaking. Braden's guiding career began with passing his BC Government Raft Guide Exams in 1994 at the age of 14. He has been training raft guides for the last ten years and is a Certified Swiftwater Rescue Instructor and a Raft Guide Examiner for the BCROA.

WHY RAFTS INSTEAD OF PONTOONS?

The bulk of the teaching will be done using Kumsheen's 16' rafts. This allows the instructor the ability to give continuous instruction and feedback, and also allows the student to learn by observing others navigate.

***Students are encouraged to bring their own boat,** contact us if you are planning on bringing a raft.

NICOLA RIVER:

The Nicola River is ideal for teaching. It is a Class 2+ river with tons of river features yet in a low-stress environment, without the wood hazard of many other rivers.

THOMPSON RIVER:

The Thompson is the ideal choice for teaching pontoon technique in the Fall - warm water, big waves, sunny weather...Did we mention world-renowned salmon and steelhead runs?
